## **Decision and reasons on application for hearing to be held in private**

You made an application that this case be held wholly in private on the basis that having your hearing in public would jeopardise an ongoing third-party interest. The application was made pursuant to Rule 19 of the 'Nursing and Midwifery Council (Fitness to Practise) Rules 2004', as amended (the Rules).

Ms Millar supported the application.

The legal assessor reminded the panel that while Rule 19(1) provides, as a starting point, that hearings shall be conducted in public, Rule 19(3) states that the panel may hold hearings partly or wholly in private if it is satisfied that this is justified by the interests of a third party or in the public interest.

The panel determined to hold the entirety of the hearing in private in order to protect a third-party interest.
