Decision and reasons on application for hearing to be held in private

At the outset of the hearing, Ms Denholm made a request that this case be held in private on the basis that proper exploration of Ms Mann's case involves reference to her [PRIVATE]. The application was made pursuant to Rule 19 of the 'Nursing and Midwifery Council (Fitness to Practise) Rules 2004', as amended (the Rules).

The legal assessor reminded the panel that while Rule 19(1) provides, as a starting point, that hearings shall be conducted in public, Rule 19(3) states that the panel may hold hearings partly or wholly in private if it is satisfied that this is justified by the interests of any party or by the public interest.

Having heard that there will be reference to her [PRIVATE], the panel determined to hold the entirety of the hearing in private in order to protect her right to privacy and confidentiality.
