## **Decision and reasons on interim order**

The panel decided to confirm and continue the current interim suspension order.

Unless there has been a material change of circumstances, a reviewing panel will review the interim suspension order at an administrative meeting within the next six months. A reviewing panel will be invited by the NMC to confirm the interim suspension order at this meeting and Ms Wilson will be notified of that panel's decision in writing following that meeting.

Alternatively, Ms Wilson is entitled to have the interim suspension order reviewed at a hearing. This means that Ms Wilson will be able to attend and make representations, send a representative on Ms Wilson's behalf or submit written representations about whether the interim order continues to be necessary. Ms Wilson must inform her case officer if she would like the interim suspension order to be reviewed at a hearing.

Even if Ms Wilson does not request a hearing, where there has been a material change of circumstances that might mean that the interim order should be revoked or replaced, a reviewing panel will review the interim suspension order at a hearing which Ms Wilson and her representative will be invited to attend.

Ms Wilson should notify the NMC immediately of any material change of circumstances that may affect the interim order.

At any time, Ms Wilson or the NMC may ask for the interim order to be reviewed by a panel if any relevant new information becomes available.

The NMC Case Examiners have referred the case to the Fitness to Practise Committee. The NMC will write to Ms Wilson when the case is ready for the next stage of the fitness to practise process.

This will be confirmed to Ms Wilson in writing.

That concludes this determination.
